In my 40 and plus years of music experience and devotion $I$ have gathered countless ideas, riffs, solos, melodies and chord progressions, but only when the time was right I could see the purpose of all of them. Indeed, it was like building a huge mosaic, each piece of it being the mentioned ideas, riffs, solos, melodies and chord progressions. I gathered the pieces of the entire mosaic and, at the beginning, when I got them, they hardly made sense except for their good sounding.

But then, the time came in which I could see a sense in putting that old riff with that new drum groove I made, that melody with those chord progressions....and the entire picture was made up.

Like all creators, or better whoever creates something, from a mother/father to a sculptor, I love what I musically create...and love it so muchl But we, fathers/mothers of the creature, might as well overvalue it. Nonetheless, we keep a small portion of our heart in which we hope that the rest of the world could love it, or at least appreciate it as well.


So here I am, with this very late debut album of mine. I recorded it starting from October 2013 and finished recording around February 2014. After that, two additional songs were added and I had to extend the recording up until late spring 2014. It was worth though, because the two additional tunes were a further confirmation that a step ahead in my composing capabilities was done. All the production, pre, during, and post was done with home means, by using very common tools, things that can be reached by everyone like me, with a super low budget, living in a musical world which faces an unprecedented crisis.

After recording it, I presented my work to some record companies and a couple of them responded with great appreciation for my music, which made me very proud. Even had record deals offered. But after a deeper thought I decided to release the album on my own, following the present time tendency to pull out from the traditional way of releasing albums via regular record companies.

I named it "Truly Yours because I want it to be, sincerely, my music to you, the listeners.

At the releasing of the album, I would like to give my heartily thanks to special ones, without whom this $C D$ would have never seen light.

First and most important is Jesus Christ, God Almighty, to whom I credit every single note and rhythm of my music. Could I ever thank You enough, my Lord? Hopefully, I was able to retain some of the immense inspiration you gave me in all these yearsl

THE SONGS

## 1. National Anthem <br> Composed and performed by Michael Mellner

The anthem of the CD. A maestoso, slow and rather martial tempo song with the main guitar melody doubled by 3 acoustic instruments to achieve an electric, still ethnic rock sound. This song opened all of my concerts in my 2013-2014 live gigs.
2. The ripe Stuff

Composed and performed by Michael Mellner
A fast tune with a pulsating guitar rock riff. It contains a kind of tribute to the "ripe stuff" in music, i.e. mature music. This is why I have chosen to allude to KV 525 (Eine Kleine Nachtmusik) in the middle of the song, prior to the guitar solo. In addition, at the end of the solo, several noises (drumming and scratches on strings) are used as rhythm pattern, and all of them are strictly guitar with no fx on it: just rhythm and fantasy.
3. Joshua

Composed and performed by Michael Mellner
Originally composed as intro for Warsaw Tears (see next song) in live gigs, it became a short song and was chosen to be included in the album. A heartily tribute to this special friend of mine... which is always there, for me.

## 4. Warsaw Tears

Composed and performed by Michael Mellner
Definitely my version of a love song! It allows the conjunction of powerful rock feel with fine and delicate melody.
5. Speedway Shuffle

Composed and performed by Michael Mellner
A very powerful bluesy rock tune with a shuffle andamento. It begins with a great, vehicle fx. But this time with a difference though: while most of the guitar players seem to like to simulate a motorcycle, I wanted to simulate a car.....with a particular carburetor sound: the Nascar Championship car engine. Hopefully I succeeded in having that sound reproduced. You'll be the judgel
6. Honestly

Composed and performed by Michael Mellner
A melodic rock tune, with lots of stuff and tension, especially in the solo parts, a sort of guitar dialogue cor guitar war if you like) between the electric and the acoustic/classical guitar. "Honestly" has a special place in my heart since it was the first song that I composed intended to be part of an album project. A sort of first born which encouraged me that it could be done!
7. Be the hard way

The hard \& heavy tune of the CDI Although it sounds very heavy (I have used a baritone guitar for the rhythm part) it has a definite melody messing around with Hispanic sounding Phrygian mode.

One of the most famous tune in the world....and most beautiful, I'd sayl. Kind of got in love with the main melody, and sort of had to play it on my guitar....just the main melody notes! But while playing them I could feel the immense tension and anguish in the chord progression, typical of tango music. I really hope that my interpretation, rather rockish, could have kept that feeling alive. The middle part of the song was completely rewrote, since the original one couldn't be performed, without ruining it, by forcing it into a rock version, . In addition, I wanted to do something dramatic, almost theatrical, suitable for live gigs. So I came up with the adding of a completely new powerful arrangement. Same thing goes with the end of the song. Enough tension?

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9. All I got
Composed and performed by Michael Mellner
Choir by the Firecloud Voice Ensemble
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The last tune composed for the album I came up with some vocals parts which I embellished with a hard rock guitar riff. This song is special to me because I composed it with no restriction on melody and chord progression. The album was already there... and I didn't think to add another tune. So I did it without any preoccupation on how to compose the song to be fitted in the CD. You know, many time we tend to be influenced by how our mentor composers think their songs....and we act accordingly.

Instead, this time I decided to go where my heart wanted to bring me, so no restriction on how many verses, or intros or bridges. This song was the result. Definitely I put "all I got" at the time I composed it.
